Holy Trinity C.E. Primary Academy and Nursey and the Sports Premium Funding

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. Starting from September 2013, and lasting for at least two academic years, ring-fenced funding – only to be spent on sport – will go directly to schools who will decide what is best for their children's sport needs. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. After the 2015 election, the Government have extended their commitment to primary school sport for a further two years. We also want to encourage long term participation in sports, regardless of socioeconomic factors to ensure that our quality provision inspires and motivates health and fitness for all.

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2019-20 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Holy Trinity C.E, Primary Academy and Nursey provides a wide variety of physical activities for pupils, both during the school day and on an extracurricular basis.

We believe that PE should give all children the opportunity to learn and develop the transferable skills needed to participate in sport and physical activity. Experience in PE, sport and physical activities should enthuse, inspire and allow enjoyment resulting in a noticeable increase in self-confidence for each child. Through successful implementation, children should be allowed to develop independent learning, risk taking, problem solving and team building.

Holy Trinity C.E. Primary Academy and Nursey will receive £18,000 for the academic year 2019-2020 and we intend to spend it on:

Holy Trinity C.E. Primary Academy and Nursey strives to spend Sports Premium to enable pupils to access a wide range of curriculum opportunities and to promote health and fitness for the pupils and this has been the focus of the fund over the past few years, as the overview shows.

The creation of the Sports Premium fund facility has meant that the spend is weighted heavily on the development of school resources and teaching of Physical Education. This is an investment in the school as a centre to provide regular sporting opportunities for the school and the local community in order to maintain the sustainability of quality sports provision over time. The use of student voice has been fundamental in this decision as the current cage has limitations for the provision.

Additional information

- All swimming coaches are monitored by the PE lead and any feedback from staff through monitoring
- PE lead is focussing on the collection of soft data from pupils and staff in relation to funding spend
- Sports provision is provided alongside playgroup leader support with our children at lunchtimes and after school support. Additional activities will be offered weekly on 6 weekly rotation per year group. This will be an additional hour of cardiovascular activity in addition to other provision offered and will contribute to the school's 'School Game Mark', which is overseen by Miss Scoltock, the PE lead.
