#### **SAFEGUARDING:**

We have had some recent episodes of online bullying brought to our attention. All of these incidents have happened outside school hours but the repercussions of such behaviours have then caused problems within school.

Many of these incidents are arising on PlayStation and Xbox live games such as Roblox and Fortnite, where children can communicate online with each other via headsets.

Other people can also communicate with children online and there is potential for these individuals to be adults posing as children. The most important aspect of safe gaming is firm parental controls and age appropriate settings yet in many of the incidents so far, we have found that children as young as nine have playstations with online access in their own bedrooms. Many of the parents and carers that we have spoken to are completely unaware of what their child is accessing or how to install parental controls.

It is not just limited to PlayStation's or Xboxes, many of our children have smartphones with online access and it would appear that many of these do not possess age appropriate settings and restrictions either.

Apps such as Snapchat, Instagram and Facebook have age restrictions for a reason. These restrictions are to protect your child from content that is not suitable for them to view so please be vigilant and ensure that your child is only accessing age appropriate sites and material.

We know and understand that technology can be a very difficult thing to manage but as a school we will do our very best to support our families. We have much to learn as well so it is important that you share information about new games and technology with us.

Online Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility so we must continue to work effectively in partnership to ensure the safety of our children.
