Maths

Addition and subtraction:

Year 1

-To read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition and subtraction.

Behaviour Management

Every child starts each day with a green card displayed on our class chart.

Consequence cards are given to children who don't display good behaviour.

Rewards are given to pupils for good behaviour.

Reading

Children are expected to read at home daily, with this being logged in their reading diaries.

Books will be changed once a week on a Friday. All children a Phonics Book Bag Book, a Reading for Challenge Book and a Reading for Pleasure Book.

Your child will be listened to by an adult at least once a week, this will be logged at school.

PE kits

Children need to have their PE kits in school from the first day of term. These will be sent home on the last day of term. Our PE sessions will be on a Tuesday and Friday.

Home Learning

Please support your child by listening to them read at home and signing their Reading Diary. Certificates are awarded to pupils who read a set number of books.

Your child may bring home additional phonics work relating to the sounds covered in their daily phonics session.
