



Maths

Addition and Subtraction

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as $7 = \square - 9$

Shape

- Recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes, including: 2-D shapes [for example, rectangles (including squares), circles and triangles]
- 3-D shapes [for example, cuboids (including cubes), pyramids and spheres].

Place Value to 20

- Count to and across 20, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Count, read and write numbers to 20 in numerals.
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.

Art

- Mixing: - To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

History:

- To learn about significant places and events.
- To learn about changes within living memory.

Reading

Children are expected to read at home daily, with this being logged in their reading diaries.

Books will be changed once a week on a Friday. All children a Phonics Book Bag Book, a Reading for Challenge Book and a Reading for Pleasure Book.

Your child will be listened to by an adult at least once a week, this will be logged at school.

Spellings

New spellings every Monday and tested the following Monday.

Certificates are awarded to pupils who gain high scores on 4 consecutive weeks.

PE kits

Children need to have their PE kits in school from the first day of term. These will be sent home on the last day of term. Our PE sessions will be on a Monday and Wednesday.

Good to be Green

Behaviour Management

Every child starts each day with a green card displayed on our class chart.

Consequence cards are given to children who don't display good behaviour.

Rewards are given to pupils for good behaviour.

Home Learning

Please support your child by listening to them read at home and signing their Reading Diary.

Certificates are awarded to pupils who read a set number of books.

Your child may bring home additional phonics work relating to the sounds covered in their daily phonics session.

Weekly spellings to practise.

Your child will be provided with a Mathletics, Numbots and TT Rockstars login and can access units to aid their learning in class. Children can gain certificates once reaching a certain number of points.
