We have had a busy couple of weeks in school and all children have been working hard in their classrooms.

Our wraparound care is now up and running. It is held in the Acorns centre which is situated at the side of the school and can be accessed via the Nursery gate. Parents and Carers can use the small car park next to the Nursery entrance.



Before and after school care MUST be booked and paid for at least 24 hours in advance. Payment must be made via Parentpay. If you do not have an account please speak to the office who will help you set one up.

The uniform required is as follows:

BOYS

Nursery: Burgundy sweatshirt with the school logo. Pale Blue polo shirt with school logo

Reception & KS1 - Burgundy sweatshirt with the school logo. Pale Blue polo shirt with school logo.

KS2 -Burgundy v-neck sweatshirt with the school logo. Pale blue shirt with a school tie.

AND

Grey school trousers or 'school' shorts in Summer. Sports or fashion shorts should not be worn.

Sensible school shoes in black. No trainers.

Socks should be white, grey or black.

Hair styles should be appropriate for school, with NO tramlines.

GIRLS

Nursery - Burgundy sweatshirt/cardigan with the school logo. Pale Blue polo shirt with school logo

Reception & KS1 - Burgundy sweatshirt with the school logo. Pale blue polo shirt with school logo.

KS2 -Burgundy v-neck sweatshirt with the school logo. Pale blue shirt with a school tie.

AND

Grey skirt, pinafore dress, trousers.

During Summer term, girls may wear a blue/white checked dress.

Sensible school shoes in black. High heels, dolly shoes and backless shoes are **not** permitted for health and safety reasons. No trainers.

Socks should be white or grey and tights should be grey.

Hair styles should be appropriate for school. Long hair should be tied back at all times.

Hair bands and hair ties should be burgundy, black or brown in colour and simple in design.

PE Kit

PE kit must be worn for all lessons.

PE Kit consists of navy blue shorts and t-shirts with the house colour under the arms. Trainers must be worn.

Track suit tops and jogging bottoms are also available as an optional extra and are advisable for Winter months when the children go outside for lessons.
