Maths

Shape:

- To be able to recognise, understand and draw 2D and 3D shapes.
- To be able to count edges, vertices and faces.
- To understand patterns and lines of symmetry.

- To describe how animals obtain food from plants and other animals, including the idea of a simple food chain, identifying and naming different sources of food.

English

Reading: Bug Club and Bug Club online
RWI daily phonics.

Writing: Using past and present tense; progressive form verbs; apostrophes for singular possession; exclamation, question, statement and command sentences; using the conjunctions because and when; diary writing; instructions; letter writing. Our focus will be forming letters correctly and using finger spaces.

Handwriting: Forming letters correctly and using some diagonal and horizontal joins.

Grammar: How to write in our books and leaving spaces between words.

Spelling: Spellings linked to RWI phonics and common exception words.

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Reading

Children are expected to read at home daily, with this being logged in their reading diaries.

Books will be changed once a week on a Friday. All children a Phonics Book Bag Book, a Reading for Challenge Book and a Reading for Pleasure Book.

Your child will be listened to by an adult at least once a week, this will be logged at school.

Spellings

New spellings every Friday and tested the following Monday.

Certificates are awarded to pupils who gain high scores on 4 consecutive weeks.

PE kits

Children need to have their PE kits in school from the first day of term. These will be sent home on the last day of term. Our PE sessions will be on a Monday and Thursday.

Good to be Green

Behaviour Management:

Every child starts each day with a green card displayed on our class chart.

Consequence cards are given to children who don't display good behaviour.

Rewards are given to pupils for good behaviour.

Home Learning

Please support your child by listening to them read at home and signing their Reading Diary. Certificates are awarded to pupils who read a set number of books.

Your child may bring home additional phonics work relating to the sounds covered in their daily phonics session.

Weekly spellings to practise.

Your child will be provided with a Mathletics, Numbots and TT Rockstars login and can access units to aid their learning in class. Children can gain certificates once reaching a certain number of points.
